Unless the U.S. government acts to offset unfair and illegal subsides to Chinese aper exports, U.S. paper production will continue to erode, leading to further job pases and widespread mill closures," said Haley. "The United States should rivestigate the widespread use of subsidies throughout China's paper industry, and impose countervailing duties whenever those harm or threaten to harm to mestic producers and workers making similar products in the United States." The rapid rise of China's paper industry has led to a growing trade deficit in aper between the U.S. and China.
